7:05 pm – Rules. The general debate rules are as follows:

 Candidates should be allowed to answer questions posed to them by the moderator in their entirety without interruption (verbal or non-verbal) until their time has elapsed.

- Candidates should also refrain from asking questions to the other candidate. The moderator will ask all the questions.
- Candidates should remain within a 4 feet radius of their table.
- Candidates should be respectful to each other, the moderator, and the audience.
- Candidates should not make unsubstantiated or misleading claims or allegations.
- Candidates should be truthful and not introduce misinformation or untruths.
- Candidates should remain seated when the other candidate is addressing the initial Question. Candidates can return to their seats or remain standing during Rebuttals and Redirects.
- Audience members are asked to please be respectful and not interrupt the proceedings and to please turn their phones off or to silent mode.
- The moderator will reserve the right to remove or sanction anyone who is not complying with these rules.
- Candidates will be given the choice to bring pre-prepared remarks or answer questions off-the-cuff.
- Candidate will have a table and chair to use for the debate. They may stand when addressing a question, as well as during rebuttals and responses.
- The moderator will stand behind a podium in between the two candidates. There will be a microphone on each podium/table.

7:08 pm - Introductions (4-minute opening statement)

- Please make short opening comments in 4 minutes or less to introduce yourself, your Vision for Orange and your sense of the challenges and opportunities for the town over the next two-year term.
- Candidate A will go first, then Candidate B will go second. (TBD by coin flip prior to debate at 6:30 pm)

7:16 pm - Questions

- Approach: pose question to Candidate A for up to a 3-minute response followed by up to a 3-minute rebuttal from the other candidates (please raise your hand if you would like to provide a rebuttal).
- After the rebuttal, the original speaker will have the opportunity to respond for up to 1 minute. The moderator has the discretion to include an additional rebuttal or to follow up with a candidate.
- The next question will flip Candidate A and B.
- The order will be Candidate A first then Candidate B then A then B until the final question.
- Candidates should not ask the other candidate questions. Question will come from the moderator only.
